Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending April 24, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending April 24, 2022, nearly 56.2 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total of over 11.5 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 28.8% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.2% and USA at 5.0%.
- The number of African countries with updated data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51, of which only 10 released new data on vaccination in this week. As of April 24, 2022, a total of 471,960,601¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 4.1% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 17.0% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (11.5%), South Africa (7.3%) and Nigeria (7.2%). As of April 24, 2022, 16.2% of Africa's population has completed² vaccination and 21.3% have received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, April 24, 2022, over 105.2 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 64.9% of the tests conducted in Africa as of April 24, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.1%), Morocco (10.9%), Egypt (5.9%), Rwanda (5.0%), Nigeria (4.8%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.3%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.2%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of April 24, 2022, stands at 78,582. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 943,801 tests per 1 million people, followed by Eswatini (872,949), Cabo Verde (859,297), Gabon (715,487), South Africa (410,271) and Rwanda (404,048).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 509,538,175, of which 90.7% have recovered. The majority cases (37.1%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (28.9%), North America (19.2%), South America (11.1%) and Africa (2.2%).
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 4,954,400, indicating a 23.0% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.

¹ The total vaccination figures indicate the total number of vaccines administered including both vaccinations completed and at least one dose.

² Completed vaccination refers to population that has taken the minimum required doses of vaccination depending on the type of vaccine.

- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 6,218,019, of which 19,802 were recorded in the week ending April 24, 2022. This was 9.1% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases decreased by 1,998,962 cases in the week under review bringing the total, as of April 24, 2022, to 41,177,223.
- Africa makes 2.2% of the total global cases, 4.1% of deaths, 2.3% of recovered cases and 1.1% of active cases as of April 24, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of April 24, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,456,774³, 65.1% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (32.8%), Morocco (10.2%), Tunisia (9.1%), Egypt (4.5%), Libya (4.4%) and Ethiopia (4.1%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Comoros with cases ranging between 5,953 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,100 in Comoros. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 423,126 in Seychelles to 71,285 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 25,909 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 42.9% higher than the new cases recorded the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 0.5% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 90.3% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (4.7%), East Africa (3.7%), West Africa (1.3%) and Central Africa (0.1%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa increased by 14,007 cases to a total of 457,578 in the week under review. Currently, five countries collectively account for 62.3% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (18.1%), Algeria (17.6%), Uganda (13.2%), Egypt (5.8%) and the Democratic Republic of Congo (7.6%).
- From a regional perspective, all the regions, except Central and Southern Africa, recorded declines in active cases, at varying degrees, during the week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of April 24, 2022, a total of 252,768 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.5% were in Southern Africa, 33.0% in North Africa, 10.3% in East Africa, 4.4% in West Africa and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging between 100,303 in South Africa and 7,510 in

Ethiopia. A total of 216 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 15.3% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa and North Africa at 2.4%. As of April 24, 2022, sixteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.9%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (4.8%), Liberia (4.0%), Niger (3.5%), Malawi (3.1%), The Gambia (3.0%), Mauritius (2.6%), Tunisia (2.7%), South Africa (2.7%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.5%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%) and Senegal (2.3%).


Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of April 24, 2022, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,656,294, representing 93.0% of its total confirmed cases⁴. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 97.9% for West Africa, 96.8% for Southern Africa, 93.4% for North Africa, 83.3% for Central Africa and 76.0% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 11,673 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.

⁴ Burundi has not been publishing new data on recovered cases and deaths since 6 January 21. Tanzania is not currently reporting on recovered cases. Additionally, Liberia, Benin, Rwanda, Sudan, Tanzania, Somalia, Cameroon, CAR, Chad and DRC have not reported recovered cases for more than three weeks.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending April 24, 2022

- As of Sunday, April 24, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 316,431. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 6,256,698 and 42,705 respectively. The region reported 22 new cases during the week, which was 93.0¹ percent lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,441, of which one (1) is new death reported during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 263,612, of which 3 were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 48,378, indicating an increase of 18 cases during the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Chad.
- Cameroon accounted for 37.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Chad accounted for 81.8% of the new cases reported during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Chad at 7,396.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of April 24, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending April 24, 2022

- As of Sunday, April 24, 2022, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 1,342,155. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 19,840,203 and 52,838 respectively. The region reported 950 new cases in the week, which is a 15.0% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 26,080, of which 9 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,020,306¹, of which 2,022 were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 205,635, indicating a decline of 1,094 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Seychelles accounted for 44.1% of the new cases reported in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Comoros at 8,100 of which 97.9% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of April 24, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.9% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending April 24, 2022


- As of Sunday, April 24, 2022, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 3,546,189. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 25,667,088 and 124,335 respectively. The region reported 1,213 new cases in the week, which is a 76.3% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 83,497, of which 27 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 3,311,193, of which 1,941 were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 151,499, indicating a decline of 755 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Tunisia followed by Morocco.
- Morocco accounted for 32.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tunisia accounted for 71.2% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 58,683 of which 98.3% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of April 24, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 4.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.










Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending April 24, 2022

- As of Sunday, April 24, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,415,030. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 38,862,675 and 182,296 respectively. The region reported 23,391 new cases in the week, which is more than double compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 127,740, of which 170 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,241,614, of which 7,235 were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 45,676, indicating an increase of 15,986 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 69.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 92.7% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 5,953 of which 98.7% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of April 24, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.9%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending April 24, 2022

- As of Sunday, April 24, 2022, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 836,969. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 14,580,424 and 36,708 respectively. The region reported 333 new cases during the week, which is an 8.0% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 11,010, of which 9 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 819,569, of which 472 were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 6,390, indicating a decline of 148 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Guinea-Bissau.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Mali accounted for 24.6% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Liberia at 7,432.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of April 24, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.0% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
